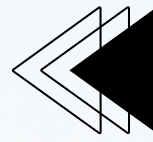


Grocery Shopping



Level: B1/Low Intermediate

Duration: 60 minutes

Course Title:

Objective:

By the end of the lesson, students will be able to:

- Use basic English vocabulary and phrases related to grocery shopping.

Materials Needed:

- Whiteboard and markers
- Flashcards with key vocabulary (e.g., fruits, vegetables, dairy products, etc.)
- Handouts with grocery shopping lists and dialogues
- Pictures of common grocery items (optional)

Warm-up (10 minutes):

- Begin the class by asking students about their grocery shopping habits. Encourage them to share their experiences in their native language.
- Introduce the topic of the day: "Grocery Shopping: Vocabulary and Phrases". Discuss the importance of this skill when living in an English-speaking country.

Presentation (15 minutes):

- Introduce key vocabulary related to grocery shopping. Use flashcards for visual aid and pronunciation practice.
- Use the whiteboard to write simple dialogues for grocery shopping and explain each part. For example, "Where can I find the...?", "How much is this...?", "I would like to buy...".
- Show pictures of common grocery items (if available) and practice using them in sentences.

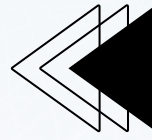
Practice (20 minutes):

- Distribute handouts with grocery shopping lists and dialogues. Students practice the dialogues in pairs, taking turns being the shopper and the store clerk.
- Conduct a listening exercise where the teacher acts as a store clerk. Students listen and then identify the items being asked for on their shopping lists.

Production (10 minutes):

- **Role-play activity:** Set up grocery store scenario where students need to ask for items and make purchases. Encourage students to use the key vocabulary and phrases learned in the lesson.

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Wrap-up (5 minutes):

- Review the key vocabulary and phrases. Ask students to provide examples of how to use them.
- Encourage students to practice grocery shopping in English outside of class. They can do this in their daily lives or by using English language learning apps or websites.

Homework:

- Write a dialogue of a grocery shopping experience, from entering the store to checking out.
- Find an English-language grocery store flyer online and practice making a shopping list.

Assessment:

- Participation in class activities and discussions.
- Accuracy and creativity in the role-play activity.
- Completion and quality of homework assignments.
